PPS Dumps Ducks for Merryman House

For the third year, Paducah Power dropped thousands of rubber ducks in the water for the Merryman House’s signature fundraiser, the Paducky Derby. Safety Milestone



When this newsletter went to print in May, Paducah Power was on track to reach a big safety milestone this month. Employees were set to mark six years without a lost time accident which is an extremely high safety record for an electric utility. The last injury that

resulted in lost work time was June 6, 2012. When this newsletter went to print, employees had worked 1,781 days without a lost time accident. PPS currently holds the American Public Power Association's RP3 diamond rating, the agency's highest rating for safety and reliability.

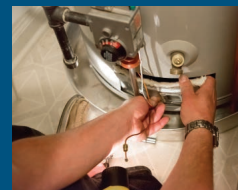
